Introducing Our New Pastoral Care Associate, Sandra Nuernberg



I was born in Stevens Point, WI, and am a twin.

My twin sister, Cindy, and I attended schools in La Crescent, MN, Appleton, WI, and La Crosse, WI. We graduated from La Crosse Central High School, and I remained in La Crosse at the UW and graduated with a B.S. degree in Medical Technology/Chemistry. My twin sister attended Mayo Clinic in Rochester, MN, and became an RN. We had a sister and brother as siblings, now both deceased.

I worked in the clinical/hospital laboratory as a medical technologist for over forty (40) years in Neenah, WI, Zurich, Switzerland (a working visa for fourteen (14 months), and Madison, WI. I taught chemistry instrumentation to students applying to our program at Meriter hospital, from universities in WI—La Crosse, Oshkosh, Madison, MATC.

I returned from Europe in 1973 and lived, worked in Madison, met and married my husband, Richard (Rick—a Swiss German!), in 1974, on a blind date! We've been here in Madison ever since, married forty-nine (49) years this month! We are both semiretired and enjoy our separate professions (law and ministry). We enjoy golf, traveling, being avid UW sports fans of hockey, football, basketball, wrestling, and volleyball. I volunteer at Attic Angel Association (now thirty-eight (38) years), University League (I am President this year), P.E.O. International, and belong to four different, interesting garden clubs. 

I attend JKP Region 4 (Madison) Clergy meetings monthly. I have enjoyed these past eighteen (18) years as a second-career pastor.

your home". Your support is appreciated!
















Pentecost Offering

On Sunday May 28, we will receive the Pentecost offering. A gift to the Pentecost Offering helps the church encourage, develop, and support its young people, and also address the needs of at-risk children. 40% of the Pentecost offering can be retained by individual congregations wanting to make an impact in the lives of young people within their own community. The remaining 60% is used to support children-at-risk, youth,

and young adults through ministries of the Presbyterian Mission Agency.

Psalm 71 testifies that a foundation of faith established during childhood helps ensure lifelong faith and service. The patterns and lessons established during these formative years continue to bear fruit throughout a person's life. By receiving the Pentecost Offering, you are nurturing the faith of those who are the church to come — children, youth, and young adults.





AED (Automated External Defibrillator)

Our church has a brand-new AED which is in a glass cabinet on the wall by the coat rack in the narthex. It was purchased with funds from Bev Mares' Memorial. Dave Mares said Bev had a BIG heart and would have approved of the AED donated in her memory. Thank you, Dave, for this generous gift.

In cardiac arrest the survival rate for cardiac arrest with no intervention is 8%. With high quality CPR and the use of an AED the survival rate dramatically increases to 60 to 80%. One of the features of the new AED is that it gives real time CPR feedback. There is a metronome that lets you know how fast to perform compressions and the machine will tell you to push harder or tell you if good quality CPR is being performed. The defibrillation pads can be used for an adult or a child.

The new AED is the easiest model on the market to use. You don't need a medical background or have taken a CPR class to use the AED. It gives step by step auditory/verbal directions as well as colored diagrams on how to use it. It literally coaches you through CPR and defibrillation (shock) and gives you the confidence to intervene in an emergency. A rescuer NEVER determines if a shock is needed, only the machine has that responsibility.

AED (cont'd.)

The first minutes after a cardiac arrest are critical and with an AED in our building, we may be able to help someone have a good outcome in an emergency.




Sunday School
